HB 1176

- Amends the drug court and mental health court statute to facilitate creation of a statewide system of accountability courts for drug offenders and offenders with mental health issues.
 - -Requires data collection
 - -Establishes standards & practices
 - Requires peer review of the drug courts by the Judicial Council

HB 1176

- Creates new categories of punishment for drug possession crimes, with less severe penalties for those found with small amounts.
- No change to penalties for distribution
- No change to penalties for felony marijuana convictions



O.C.G.A. § 16-13-31 Trafficking

Said title is further amended by revising subsection (h) of Code Section 16-13-31, relating to trafficking in cocaine, illegal drugs, marijuana, or methamphetamine and penalties, as follows:

"(h) Any person who violates any provision of this Code section in regard to trafficking in cocaine, illegal drugs, marijuana, or methamphetamine shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than five years nor as provided for in the applicable mandatory minimum punishment and for not more than 30 years <u>of imprisonment</u> and by a fine not to exceed \$1 million."
